We were so excited to have the children back- especially as reflecting back, were shocked to be



in another lockdown with limited pupils on site and we opened to a thick blanket of snow! The children have all settled back into routines brilliantly. I had the pleasure of walking (without crutches!!) around the whole school. <u>Plan B of the COVID-19 Response: Autumn and Winter Plan - Hamsey</u> <u>Green and Acorns Nursery UPDATED IN PURPLE</u>

The Government is clear on the critical importance of not disrupting the education of children and young people and the Government will prioritise keeping all education and childcare settings open. Further advice has come out this week for schools and Nationally.

Attendance

School attendance remains mandatory and all the usual rules continue to apply. Enabling children and young people to attend their education setting regularly continues to be a national priority. As usual, we are only able to grant leaves of absence for pupils in exceptional circumstances through the absence forms from the office.

Children and young people previously considered CEV should attend their setting and should follow the same <u>COVID-19 guidance</u> as the rest of the population. In some circumstances, a child or young person may have received personal advice from their specialist or clinician on additional precautions to take and they should continue to follow that advice. There will be advice coming out for those CEV from 5 years up to be vaccinated.

Face Coverings

These are already worn by staff and visitors in communal areas.

Wrap around provision

The Primary and Acorns will continue to offer their usual before and after-school activities, including wraparound childcare. These activities provide valuable childcare for working parents and carers and promote the wellbeing of children and young people. Letters have been sent home today for clubs. For those children who have not been able to attend school today, a copy of this has been enclosed with the newsletter.

Working from home

Office workers who can work from home should continue to do so **from Monday 13 December**. We expect to continue to provide face-to-face teaching in the Primary and Nursery. The Government has stated that Education and childcare leaders will be best placed to determine the workforce required to meet the needs of their children, pupils and students. Education and childcare leaders will need to consider whether it is possible for specific staff undertaking certain roles to work from home, while minimising disruption to face-to-face education and care. Following expert clinical advice and the successful rollout of the COVID-19 vaccine programme, people previously considered to be particularly vulnerable, clinically extremely vulnerable (CEV), and high or higher-risk are not being advised to shield again.

We are very lucky that we have been able to manage the impact of staff absence Covid-19 at the start of term!

Testing

We strongly encourage all those involved in education and childcare settings to continue regular testing. As of Tuesday 11th January, if you test positive on an LFD and DO NOT have symptoms, a PCR is no longer required (this will be reviewed). You are still required to report a POSITIVE LFD result via https://www.gov.uk/report-covid19-result. Please notify the school with this conformation in order to authorise absence. If a person displays symptoms then a PCR test is required still. Thank you for keeping us informed if your child is able to break isolation on day 8 following two consecutive negative LFD on day 6 and day 7.

Settings are strongly encouraged to ask parents, guardians and other visitors to take a lateral flow device (LFD) test before entering the setting. **Please help us keep our school community safe.**

ISOLATION

If a person has a negative LFD on day 6 and day 7, they can be released from isolation on day 8.

If you are identified as a close contact of Covid-19 and are vaccinated, you will need to undertake daily LFD's for 5 days. For those who are not double vaccinated (and over 18), as a direct contact you are required to isolate for 10 days.

Parking

We have been made aware that some of our families have recently received penalty notices for parking outside the school. Penalty notices are issued by the Council and



we are unfortunately unable to comment or advise on this issue. The zig zag lines are marked clearly as are the times where parking is not allowed on these markings. Please park considerately around the neighbouring properties to the school. We have had some complaints recently, of inconsiderate parking at drop off and pick up times for school and other activities. Some of our nursery parents have also noted parking issues, making it difficult when walking with their young children. We do have slightly staggered starting times to help alleviate this issue. Thank you for your assistance.
