<u>Plan B of the COVID-19 Response: Autumn and Winter Plan - Hamsey</u> <u>Green and Acorns Nursery</u>

The Government is clear on the critical importance of not disrupting the education of children and young people and the Government will prioritise keeping all education and childcare settings open.

Attendance

School attendance remains mandatory and all the usual rules continue to apply. Enabling children and young people to attend their education setting regularly continues to be a national priority. As usual, we are able to grant leaves of absence for pupils in exceptional circumstances through the absence forms from the office.

Children and young people previously considered CEV should attend their setting and should follow the same COVID-19
guidance as the rest of the population. In some circumstances, a child or young person may have received personal advice from their specialist or clinician on additional precautions to take and they should continue to follow that advice.

Face Coverings

These are already worn by staff and visitors in communal areas. As we are still in term time, we should not be having Year 7 and above students on site.

Wrap around provision

The Primary and Acorns will continue to offer their usual before and after-school activities, including wraparound childcare. These activities provide valuable childcare for working parents and carers and promote the wellbeing of children and young people.

Working from home

Office workers who can work from home should do so **from Monday 13 December**. Anyone who cannot work from home should continue to go into work – for example, to access equipment necessary for their role or where their role must be completed in-person. In-person working will be necessary in some cases to continue the effective and accessible delivery of some public services and private industries.

We expect to continue to provide face-to-face teaching in the Primary and Nursery. The Government has stated that Education and childcare leaders will be best placed to determine the workforce required to meet the needs of their children, pupils and students. Education and childcare leaders will need to consider whether it is possible for specific staff undertaking certain roles to work from home, while minimising disruption to face-to-face education and care.

Following expert clinical advice and the successful rollout of the COVID-19 vaccine programme, people previously considered to be particularly vulnerable, clinically extremely vulnerable (CEV), and high or higher-risk are not being advised to shield again.

Testing

We strongly encourage all those involved in education and childcare settings to continue regular testing (LFD not PCR) and reporting their results and to encourage pupils and students in year 7 and above to test and report their results.

Settings are strongly encouraged to ask parents, guardians and other visitors to take a lateral flow device (LFD) test before entering the setting. Please help us keep our school community safe. CONT.....

Isolation

All individuals who have been identified as a close contact of a suspected or confirmed case of the Omicron variant of COVID-19, irrespective of vaccination status and age, will continue to be required to self-isolate and asked to book a PCR test.

The Government plans to introduce Daily Contact Testing as soon as possible as an alternative to self-isolation for contacts of positive Omicron cases who are fully vaccinated or under the age of 18 years and 6 months.

January return

All PE kits and pupils possessions will be sent home over the holidays. Please ensure that pencil cases are checked and refilled for the start of term and all uniform is checked that it is named still.

It is assumed families will visit loved ones. If you are attending a high-risk situation, on the day or before visiting, especially meeting people who are at higher risk of severe illness if they get COVID-19, please take a Lateral Flow Device.

If your child demonstrates ANY symptoms of Covid-19, you will need to book them a PCR test and secure the NEGATIVE result before they can return to school. This way the school community starts the year safely.

To ensure we have the right staffing levels, please remember to book into Ocean and Surfer's Club and book your child's school dinners before returning on Wednesday 5th January.

Please remember that pupils are unable to participate in PE for 6 weeks if they have their ears pierced—something best saved for the long Summer holidays.

Word of the Week

Some of our nursery parents have also noted parking issues, making it difficult when walking with their young children. We do have slightly staggered starting times to help alleviate this issue. COVID testing

Schools are being encouraged to ask their community to continue to regularly test using lateral flow tests. They can be ordered online here.

If you have secondary school aged children: Based on recent UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA, formally PHE) advice. We have been advised to encourage students or staff **identified as contacts** in secondary schools to also test daily on a lateral flow device until they receive their PCR test result.
