Sports Premium Funding 2022-2023 Department for Education Vision for the primary PE and Sport Premium is: ALL pupils leaving primary school physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport. The Government's Ambition is for all children and young people take part in at least 60 minutes of physical activity every day. As set out in the Childhood Obesity Plan, at least 30 minutes should take place in schools, and the remaining 30 outside the school day. Children and young people have the opportunity to realise developmental, character-building experiences through sport, competition and active pursuits. All sport and physical activity provision for children and young people is designed around the principles of physical literacy, focuses on fun and enjoyment and aims to reach the least active.

This is now the ninth year of the sports premium funding and once again Hamsey Green Primary School will be receiving a larger sum of money which is ring fenced to PE and Sport. Schools are free to spend the Sports Premium as they see fit. However, we will be held accountable for how we have used the funding which should be sustainable and new. The premium must be used to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils, in the 2022 to 2023 academic year, to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles.

Schools are required to publish online information about how we have used the Sports Premium. This will ensure that parents and others are made fully aware of the attainment of pupils in PE covered by the Premium and the extra provisions they receive.

This year, Hamsey Green has had great success in competitive sports. We have come 3<sup>rd</sup> in the local school's swimming gala- placing for the first time. Hamsey Green has won the local schools District Cup. Year 6 football team has won the local schools league and cup, and the netball team has come 3<sup>rd</sup>! We have seen an increase in the number of children participating in Cross-Country and have placed in many of the local school competitions. Year 1&2 won the local schools Multi-skills Competition and Year 3 & 4 came 4<sup>th</sup>. Hamsey Green have entered their first gymnastic competition and due to popularity- has increased the number of days the club runs on. 12 of our Year 6 children have run the local schools Active-Fun morning event as young leaders.
