



Hamsey Green Uniform Policy

At Hamsey Green, we strive for our children to look smart but are also comfortable. We believe that the school uniform helps us belong and gives us an identity that we are proud of. The way in which the uniform is worn is a reflection on the school and its standards.

Hamsey Green students are expected to present themselves neatly and adhere to the requirements of the uniform code. Uniform should be worn on the way to and from school, throughout the day and on school journeys (unless otherwise instructed.) **All clothing worn to school should be clearly marked with your child's name.**

Most of our uniform can be purchased from High Street shops and supermarkets.

Trousers/Shorts - charcoal grey	Skirt/pinafore dress/culottes - charcoal grey
Hamsey Green sweatshirt or cardigan - bottle green with logo*	Polo shirt (long or short sleeved) - white
Socks - grey, black or white, no logos	Summer dress/playsuit - green/white checked (Summer term)
Tights - black or grey	Shoes - plain black sensible shoes, velcro or buckle fastenings; no logo Suitable footwear at all times is essential. In particular heels should be kept low. Open toed sandals are not permitted for safety reasons.

Jewellery

Watches may be worn but standard display only please, smart watches are not permitted. Watches are brought into school at children's own risk.

Earrings: If ears are pierced, only studs are allowed, for health and safety reasons. We politely ask that children only have their ears pierced at the beginning of the summer holidays.

For PE, earring should either be removed, or taped up. Taping should be sufficient to prevent injury from an unintentional blow and needs to be done at home for younger children, and at school where older children may do the task themselves. Teachers are not able to do the taping for pupils, but will retain the right to exclude a pupil from PE in any circumstances where they feel the pupil is at risk.

The use of retainers (flat studs that retain the piercing when earrings or studs are removed) can be used provided these are flat and cannot cause damage if a blow or ball hits the side of the head, the level of risk is clearly reduced.

No jewellery, including studs are to be worn during PE, including swimming.

Hair & Make-Up

Any hair longer than shoulder length, must be tied back using a hair tie coloured green, white or black of a sensible size. We do not permit extreme hairstyles, dyed hair with shavings or markings.

Make-up and nail varnish must not be worn to school.

Exceptions may be made for Mufti days and other special occasions; this is at the discretion of the headteacher.

Head Covering

Religious head coverings e.g. a Hijab should be plain and dark coloured

Year 6 Leavers hoodies: These are not provided by the school; this is something that is organised by the Year 6 parents. If the parents choose to match these to Hamsey Green colours (blue) these can only be worn in school on PE days after the May half term when children have taken their SATs at the discretion of the headteacher.

Stationary –ONLY KS2 pupils require a sensible sized pencil case. This should include, a pencil, ruler, rubber, blue handwriting pen (not biros), red and black biros and colouring pens and pencils.

Lost Property

Please ensure that all children's belongings are clearly named. Named lost property is returned to the child. Unnamed lost property is kept in the porch by the outside first aid room/by Year 2. If it unclaimed is then sold in the pre-loved uniform sale or recycled. Pre-loved uniform is available from The Friends of Hamsey Green PTA.
