Support for disadvantaged pupils with SEND prior to funding	The time scales for obtaining an Educational Health Care Plan and the associated funding are such that at Hamsey Green, we put support in place prior to receiving from the local authority. Funding additional support in excess of EHCP funding and closing the gap intervention	Disadvantaged pupils have access to additional 1:1 support and group interventions detailed below in order to close the gap between peers and raise attainment. 6. (SAP) School Attendance and Punctuality	Pastoral Leader/ Attendance Officer track and monitor pupil attendance and punctuality. Office administration send letters of concern sent to the parent/carer if attendance falls below 90%, ask for medical details. if there is no improvement, arrange meetings with the Pastoral leader to support and work with families. 7. Maths Intervention	Number Box, Power of 2 and 1:1 precision teaching, small group intervention to accelerate progress in maths.	Daily sessions across school	£15,685	
8. Reading Intervention	Project X code and Reading Explorer Small reading intervention for children who are a year or more behind in their word reading. It combines phonics and comprehension development in a character adventure series, engaging children and closing gaps in their learning. 1:1 additional reading	Year 1/2/3/4/5 4 x sessions a week	Included in cost of £15,685	

9. Writing Intervention	Rapid Write: Small group writing intervention to close the attainment gap in writing using engaging contexts. Encourages self-confidence with a focus on grammar and spelling. Writing Booster groups: Small Group writing boosters with additional year 6 teacher	Year 1/2/3/4/5 4 x sessions a week Year 6	Included in cost of £15,685	
10. KS2 Maths intervention groups	Maths booster groups: Small group maths boosters with additional year 6 teacher	Daily Years 6	£10,000	
11. Breakfast items	For pupils identified as not receiving adequate breakfast as identified by learning mentor	Whole school	£120	
12. Play therapy Play therapist	On a needs basis if Hub is unable to address needs: A therapeutic intervention to help pupils understand muddled feelings and upsetting events that they have not had the chance to sort out properly. Children can use play to communicate at their own level and at their own pace without feeling interrogated or threatened.	TBC	TBA	

13. Pupil Welfare	Funding set aside to assist with payment for uniforms, equipment and school trips.	All year groups	£2,000	
14. Out of school learning	Funding set aside to pay for extracurricular activities to pay for pupils who otherwise would not benefit from them	All year groups	£1250
