

Sports Premium Funding 2020-2021 Department for Education Vision for the primary PE and Sport Premium is: ALL pupils leaving primary school physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

This is now the seventh year of the sports premium funding and once again Hamsey Green Primary School will be receiving a larger sum of money which is ring fenced to PE and Sport. Schools are free to spend the Sports Premium as they see fit. However, we will be held accountable for how we have used the funding which should be sustainable and new. The funding is there; to help support teachers with training, with a view to increase their subject knowledge; to ensure all children participate and compete in school sports, increase competitiveness in school sports and work in partnerships with other schools and clubs to establish sustainable links. Schools are required to publish online information about how we have used the Sports Premium. This will ensure that parents and others are made fully aware of the attainment of pupils in PE covered by the Premium and the extra provisions they receive.
