This week, I have been excited to visit all classes to observe their lessons. I have been delighted to see the children engaged in their learning from Reception enjoying story time and painting; Year 1 engrossed in finding parts of whole numbers; Year 2 reciting their text map for their news report 'The Big Bad Wolf' to me and our Trust CEO; Year 3 being scientists investigating which material have the most friction; Year 4 and 5 in PE and Year 6 learning to record multiplying two digit numbers by a two digit number! I was particularly excited to sit in on music lessons for Year 5 and Year 6 who are learning to play the glockenspiels and xylophones. I was so impressed with them all keeping to the same rhythm and ability to learn a tune. It is amazing the breadth of learning that

our children have.



On Monday, Miss Walker led assembly on Dyslexia Awareness Day. Children were really engaged to learn about dyslexia and the strategies people use to support this. On Thursday, Mr Brown helped us celebrate National Poetry Day too by reading us



lots of poems. We hoped this would inspire them to read more poems for enjoyment. Some were really funny!

I do hope you have all had a chance to look at the children's photographs—they looked lovely! It is not always easy to take photos on a child let alone over 300!

This week we had an external advisor who visited during lunchtime. She was extremely complimentary about the behaviour of the children, how well they played together and the older children were nurturing the younger children. It is always nice to know others spot how caring and polite our children are!
