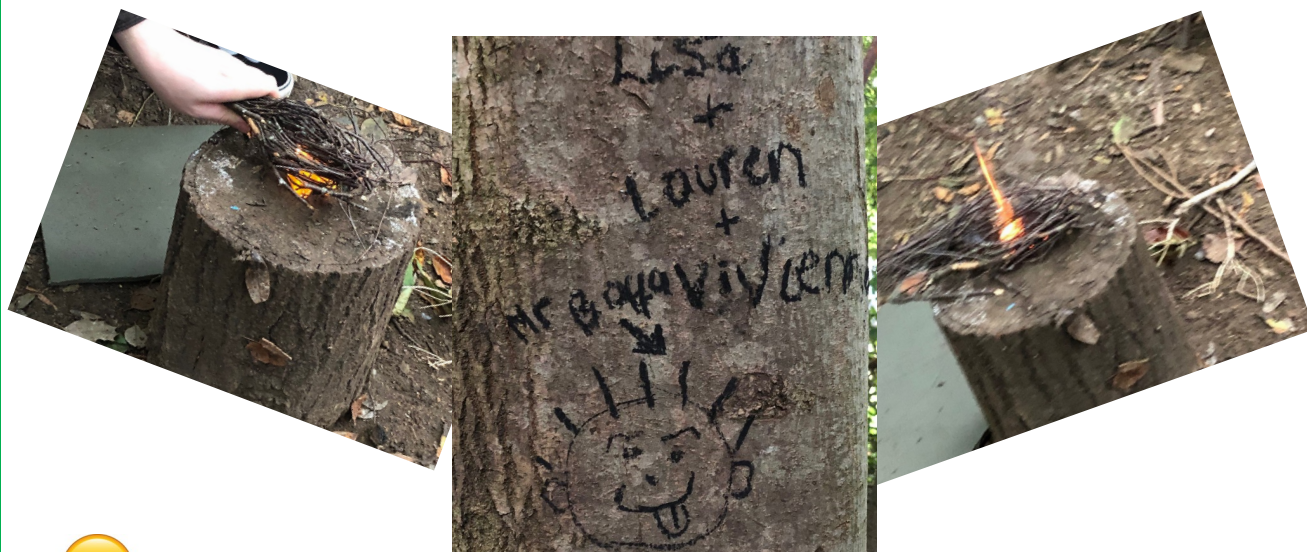
On Monday, in assembly, we introduced our themed week of Black History and shared how Black History links to our community. Children in Year 6 learnt about 'Windrush' and how the arrival of so many from the Caribbean, transformed British culture. Year 3, focused on how Marcus Rashford used his status in football to show awareness of the support needed for families who are struggling.



On Tuesday, we have also shown how generous our community is by donating plenty of non-perishable food for our Harvest Festival. Mrs Mellis led the children in song and shared with the school how their donations would help the less fortunate and Night Watch who support homelessness.

The staff had some extra Forest School training- all about making fires, using sticks as charcoal pencils and even roasting marshmallows. We are looking forward to planning these fun activities with the children in the future. SPORTS REPORT BY THE FOOTBALL TEAM

"Hamsey Green began their first league game in 2 years. They were hoping to pick up something from a difficult game away at St John's. Picking a predominantly Y5 team, Hamsey dominated much of the early play - Lucas narrowly missing a trio of chances. With five minutes of the half left to play, Hamsey conceded a corner after a good defensive play, snuffed out a rare St John's foray into the opposition half. Shortly after half time, Hamsey got an equaliser when Lucas was finally rewarded for his earlier hard work, shooting from short range.
