

## **COVID** testing

Schools are being encouraged to ask their community to continue to regularly test using lateral flow tests. They can be ordered online <u>here</u>.

If you have secondary school aged children: Based on recent UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA, formally PHE) advice. We have been advised to encourage students or staff **identified as contacts** in secondary schools to also test daily on a lateral flow device until they receive their PCR test result.
