#### Dear All

This week has been a whirlwind! I have had the pleasure of teaching many children this week covering classes as we have had many poorly staff members. We are hoping they are on the mend now and look forward to their return. Thank you so much for your understanding and a huge thank you to the staff who have covered classes too, in order to keep classes open. I have to say though, I have been so pleased at the children's resilience, ability to kindly support the adults teaching them and continue to engage in their learning. We have had a focus on celebrating British Science Week! The theme of Science Week nationally is 'Growth' and we have also used our Science topics to deepen our knowledge. Each class has planted seeds and will help nurture them as the year progresses. We are also quite excited as our jubilee seeds arrived this week, sent from The Royal Palaces— we are hoping these will bloom in time for our Jubilee themed summer fair!

Year 2 have been growing caterpillars too!! The caterpillars have grown fast as they are near the warm radiator and are preparing to move to the top and form their chrysalides now. The children have been observing them closely and writing about them. I am sure they will be so excited to release them into the forest school in a few weeks time. I have had the delight of teaching Year 4 a lot this week and we have been investigating sound. They have designed and made their own musical instruments from recyclable material and junk modelling. I was extremely impressed with them!

On Thursday, we were very excited as the Science teachers from Warlingham secondary school came to show us some experiments!! We learnt about particles and how heat affects them. We saw how metal grows when heated up, about the growth of stalactites in caves how yeast grows and the most exciting—how to make elephant's toothpaste!

Over the course of this week and next, the whole school will be also learning about S.T.E.M. (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths). We have been very lucky to have workshops for every class run by Discovery with Three. We are very grateful to Mr McDonald who has delivered these.

Science week has been fully embraced at Acorns Nursery! Each day, a member of staff has led a science based focus activity with the children. The children have grown cress seeds and have checked each day for developments. We have observed the changing effects when marshmallows are cooked during a baking activity; in addition to predicting what objects might float or sink during a water experiment. We have also made a junk box volcano which we used to create a chemical reaction eruption in the garden as well as experimenting with bubbles. What a busy week!
