
School Dinners

"We're really pleased to offer parents and carers of Year 6 pupils anywhere out there a free workshop to help you prepare them – and yourselves – for the big move on to secondary school. It'll be on zoom with Fiona and Asha on Monday 4th July 7 - 8.30pm, including time for plenty of questions.

It can be both an exciting and worrying time, for children and parents alike, and this workshop is designed to give you an insight into some of the situations your child may encounter, strategies they can use to keep themselves safe, and ideas for talking about all this at home.

The workshop will involve finding out about:

- Substances your child may come across, when and where, and their effects and risks
- Building protective factors, including problem-solving, coping skills and resilience
- Factors that affect young people's decisions about drugs and alcohol, including teenage brain development

• How to have effective conversations with your child, and practical suggestions for what you can do to support them to stay safe

• Where to go for more information and support.
