

Sports Premium Funding 2021-2022 Department for Education Vision for the primary PE and Sport Premium is: ALL pupils leaving primary school physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

This is now the eigth year of the sports premium funding and once again Hamsey Green Primary School will be receiving a larger sum of money which is ring fenced to PE and Sport. Schools are free to spend the Sports Premium as they see fit. However, we will be held accountable for how we have used the funding which should be sustainable and new. The premium must be used to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils, in the 2020 to 2021 academic year, to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles. Schools are required to publish online information about how we have used the Sports Premium. This will ensure that parents and others are made fully aware of the attainment of pupils in PE covered by the Premium and the extra provisions they receive.
